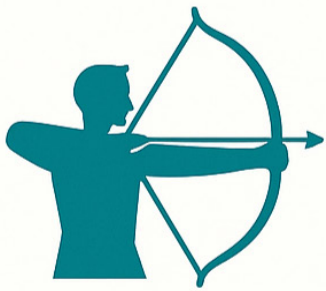

Legacy is Built Intentionally

Heroes do not leave legacies by accident. They build them moment by moment—through compassion, conversation, and courage. A father who fires without aiming risks raising children without direction.

Purposeful Father

- Plans with vision
- Present and prayerful
- Motivated by purpose
- Lives as a faithful hero

Aimless Father

- Reacts to each day
- Distracted or disengaged
- Motivated by pride
- Drifts toward villain or ghost roles

Faith in the Process

No father is perfect. There will be days of distraction, frustration, or fatigue. But the good news is—you can always take aim again.

God’s Spirit gives strength in weakness, wisdom in confusion, and grace when you miss the mark. Every small, intentional act becomes a step toward legacy.

Engage your children. Ask them questions about what they want to do in life, and support them as they work toward those goals. Help them create a step-by-step plan to get there. A vision is powerful, but as a father who leads, you must also have a vision. Write it down so your children can see it and run toward the purpose God has placed in their hearts.
